Midway District 4-H Shooting Sports will be hosting a shooting sports match for archery. This match is a state qualifier. All levels of shooters are invited to participate from 4-H age 9-18. Awards will be given in each discipline and age group.

This is a FITA state qualifying match. Juniors (9-13 yrs. Old) will shoot 12 arrows at 30 meters and 12 arrows at 20 meters. Seniors (14-18 yrs. Old) will shoot 12 arrows at 40 meters and 12 arrows at 30 meters.

Current ATA and 2026 Kansas State Match Rules apply.

To qualify for the State Match in archery the minimum individual scores are:

Recurve Bare Bow- 120 points possible 240

Recurve Olympic - 140 points of a possible 240

Compound Bow Hunter - 200 points of a possible 240

Compound Open- 210 points of possible 240

Note: the minimum age to participate at the State Match is 9 years old before January 1, 2026.

Registration form is due by 5 pm, July 6, 2026. Registration Fees are \$15 per shooter, pay the day of the event. Registration will only be accepted from one person per county. Registration begins at 8:30 am. The FITA match will begin at 9:00 am. Shooters may be divided up into different times depending on the number of participants. **Each county needs to verify their shooters information when checking in for correct age, disciplines.**

No concession stand will be available.
